OUR MISSION

YOUR COMMITMENT

We want you to display these following 4 traits in your life. Just as you grow in Christ, and the spiritual fruit you produce through your love and commitment to Jesus multiplies, we strive to help and expect you to produce these four qualities in abundance.

Character: You have acknowledged your love and commitment for the lord. We expect you to continuously grow in your relationship with Jesus personally and as a group. We expect high standards of living, within the context of Christ Chapel events, school, family life, social media, and friend groups. These higher standards should take the form or growth in the fruit of the spirit. We expect your speech and language to be wholesome, edifying, and showing uprightness when talking about situations and especially people. We expect you to be gracious and understanding. Just like you and me, others are broken and sinners, and conversations will be challenging, messy, and maybe even annoying. We expect a stature of truly listening and caring. Often, what people need is grace and love to change a situation, and not just the right answer.

Humility: You are taking on more responsibility and owning your faith, and as sinners we tend to think we are more spiritually mature and advanced. This does not correlate with leading as Jesus led. We expect a higher level of humility. You may understand more and know more than others, but that should mean you understand you're more of a sinner than you used to understand, and in more need of grace day by day. We expect a posture of humility when learning as well as when you're mentoring your mentees.

Hard Work: You're pouring into people's lives, which can be tiring and emotional, and we expect you to be able to pursue and persevere when the going gets tough. We also expect you to regularly attend the trainings, meetings, and the occasional Mentor Team fellowships.

Love: We are family, and we are sinners, and that creates an environment for messiness. We hold ourselves as well as you to a posture of understanding this. We encourage and expect you to act in love towards the people you encounter, and to be gracious, compassionate, humble and gentle when things get dicey.
